

# The eArchiving academic curriculum

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### Why a curriculum?

- Many archiving organisations struggle to find staff with the appropriate skills to deliver eArchiving effectively.
- One often cited reason for this skills shortage is the lack of appropriately trained graduates leaving universities and other higher education establishments.
- The eArchiving initiative intends to redress this imbalance.



### Academic Curriculum Working Group

 The Consortium has established an Academic Curriculum Working Group and begun a scoping exercise to help map current provision in the Higher Education sector and determine where gaps exist. The information from the scoping and user needs analysis will be used to develop the Curriculum.

  - OAIS, METS, PREMIS, SIARD, ISAD(G), EAD, E-ARK
- What types of digital documents/data should be studied in an academic curriculum?
  - Text documents, video, audio, digital images, e-mail, social media , websites, geospatial data, databases
- Digital archiving tools
  - Archival management tools, digital preservation tools
