Digital Act

Belgian law of July 21st 2016 regarding trust services



Transposition of the e-IDAS Regulation Identification of requirements

- Definition of a framework for trust services
- Confirmation of the principles of nondiscrimination, assimilation and technological neutrality
- Retention of only 2 levels: trusted service and qualified trusted service

Preservation of integrity, legibility and authenticity

- Ensuring faithful and durable reproduct
- Minimum metadata management
- Documentation on
 - How to access
 - Security policy
 - Preservation policy
 - Continuity policy

Standard & audit scheme

Royal Decree 29 March 2019

- Presumption of conformity by follow standards
- Qualification scheme published in 2

European Commission

Creation of qualified archiving

- Definition of a reference for digital archiving with 2 components
 - Digital preservation
 - Scanning
- Possibility of using a trusted service provider or being certified on one's own behalf
- Several recognised qualification schemes

- For the "organisational" part
- Common to all eIDAS trust services

Archiving with legal value

The digital document is *de facto* recognised and archiving under the Digital Act demonstrates its legal value.



Qualified archiving following eIDAS

There is no qualification requirement, but

- Qualified archiving reverses the burden of proof
- Provides a presumption of heritage archiving

Several standards are identified as the basis for compliance, but all are based on the Open Archival *Information System* model



Digital Act

2 sides of the coin



Too long timeline

3 years between legal text and royal decree; and yet three years to get the certification scheme.



Few market impact Only 1 qualified provider so far. Few or no interest in already existing solution



Few or no legal references

The Digital Act should have been a reference for entire digital preservation legal framework.

Standards confusion

Still a confusion on the standard to use and difference with the certification scheme
